**From Washington.**  
WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.  
**FOREIGN MISCELLANY.**  
The Bonapartists are very active. Piefri, Vandal and General Florio are at Wilhelmschlo. By the terms of the capitulation the National Guards captured at Longwy will not be held as prisoners. Couriers pass constantly between Goshelien and Wilhelmschlo and Versailles. The Marlon Emerson, reported on, has been burned to the water's edge. A small portion of the cargo was saved.

**From New York.**  
NEW YORK, Jan. 28.  
The Herald's special with Paris dates to the 26th, which says that on Saturday night a crowd of citizens of Bellville and other quarters, who had been threatened a mischief since the fall of the Sorbie on the 19th, gathered in numbers, and having arrived at the prison of Mass, where Floren, Miller and other political prisoners are incarcerated, after various lotus demonstrations—gathering courage in the absence of opposition—made a regular attack upon the prison and beat down the gates with hammers, stones and iron bars. The jailer and turnkeys fled for their lives, leaving the jail free to the inmates, who found Floren, Miller, and their companions, who were borne forth in triumph amidst cries of "Abas Parre! Abas Parre!"
