LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY.

We make up the following summary of the proceedings of the Legislature from the report in the Sentinel. SENATE. EVENING SESSION. WEDNESDAY, March 15. SPECIAL ORDER.

Bill to allow railroad and other corporations to purchase the stock of the State in such corporations by returning to the Treasury the bonds with which such stock was obtained, and for other purposes. On second reading.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. THURSDAY, March 16, 1871. By Mr. McCanley: A bill in relation to suits against railroad companies; referred.

On motion of Mr. Martin, a bill to consolidate the Atlantic & N. C. and North Carolina Railroads, was taken up and made special order for Wednesday next at 11 o'clock.

On motion of Mr. Houston, a bill on the salaries and fees of county officers and Supreme Court Clerk, was taken up, and the report of the Conference Committee concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Chamberlain, a bill to incorporate the North Carolina Stock Raising and Fish Company, was taken up and passed its several readings.
