LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY.

We make up the following summary of the proceedings of the Legislature from the report in the Sentinel:

SENATE.

TUESDAY, April 4, 1871. Senate concurred in House amendment to bill in regard to the donation of public lands in Onslow county, to the Planters R. R. Bill incorporating the South Carolina and Shelby railroad company, taken up and passed its last reading. Bill to authorize the commissioners of Columbus county to levy a special tax, passed. Mr. Edwards, a resolution, that the officers in the township lying in that portion of Edgecombe recently transferred to Nash, be continued in office until the next general election, passed its several readings.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

TUESDAY, April 4. On motion of Mr. Sparrow, the resolution in relation to the contract made between S. T. Carrow and D. P. Bibbes and the State in relation to the sale of certain lands in the eastern portion of the State, was taken up. The resolution declares the contract null and void, and authorizes the Treasurer to receive an instalment of \$5,000 now due on the contract, and provides that if the contract is fully complied with, then, in two years the proper authorities shall make a title to the property, but if in that time the contract is not complied with, then the Attorney General shall prosecute the claim. After quite a lengthy debate, Mr. Hill, (dem.) moved to lay the resolution on the table. The motion to table was put to a vote and lost for the want of a quorum.
