The Board met on Friday evening, May 26th pursuant to adjournment. Hon. S. N. Martin in the chair.

The Board met on Saturday morning, pursuant to adjournment. It was ordered that the order passed at the meeting of the Board held May 19th, 1871, be and is hereby amended, to read as follows:

Class lot section 1st. On every one hundred dollars in value of real and personal property in the county, subject to exemption as mentioned in sec. 1, class 1, 25 cents and for the purpose of maintaining Schools in said county 10 cents on the one hundred dollars valuation.

The Board met on Saturday morning, pursuant to adjournment. It was ordered that the order passed at the meeting of the Board held May 19th, 1871, be and is hereby amended, to read as follows:

Proceedings of the Fifty-Fifth Annual Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Diocese of North Carolina. The Convention met at 10 o'clock, Bishop Atkinson in the chair.

On motion, Rev. E. B. Sutton, Chairman of the Committee on Elections, the following resolution was adopted: That the Clergy of the Diocese of North Carolina be and they are authorized to meet in Convention on the 1st day of June next.

Resolved, That a Committee of three, two Clergymen and one Layman, be appointed by the Bishop to confer with experienced Canonists in the framing of a Canon in relation to the appointment of Suffragan Bishops.

Resolved, That the Bishop of this Diocese be requested to communicate to such Bishops, as they may deem especially interested in securing the office of Suffragan Bishops, the action of this Convention, and call for possible their cooperation.

Resolved, That the following shall be added to the rules of the order: Thursday and Friday each session shall be devoted entirely to Legislative business, and upon no other day of the Session shall such business be in order.
