The U. S. District Court—Trial of the Biggerstaff Cases, &c. [Special Dispatch to the Petersburg Index.]

RALEIGH, N. C., Sept. 23, 1871. Last night the court sat until rather a late hour, and one of the Biggerstaff cases was disposed of. It was an indictment against J. H. Witherlow, Wm. McIntire, W. Teal, Jas. Hunt, and Thos. Tomes, for wounding Aaron Biggerstaff, and assaulting him while on his way to testify as a witness, under process of law before a United States Commissioner.

Look Out for the Outlaws. We have been furnished with the following description of the notorious Robeson county outlaws. It would be well for our readers generally to preserve a copy of this description: As it is possible that the Lowrey gang of outlaws, now infesting Robeson county, North Carolina, singly or in a body, attempt to escape from that section, the following description of the gang is given, in order that the public may be posted in regard to them.

Henry Berry Lowrey is about five feet eight inches high, weighs about 145 or 150 lbs., is tall and square built, has straight dark hair, dull blue eyes, and is so nearly white, that he might readily pass for a white man. He has a black mark immediately under his left eye, made by falling on a post in his youth.

Andrew Strong is 31 years of age, five feet seven or eight inches high, deep black hair and eyes, is of a swarthy, dark brown complexion, thin visaged, rather stooping habit, and is quick spoken. He has a bushy mustache and goatee, very black but thin.

Stephen Lowrey is 31 years of age, five feet seven or eight inches high, deep black hair and eyes, is of a swarthy, dark brown complexion, thin visaged, rather stooping habit, and is quick spoken. He has a bushy mustache and goatee, very black but thin.

Thomas Lowrey is about six feet high, tolerably heavy built, weighs about 200 lbs, has a dull blue eye and a pleasing countenance, is nearly white and will readily pass as such. He has a full face, dark hair and beard and is rather quick spoken, with a low and pleasant voice. He has been wounded by gunshot in his left arm and back. He is about twenty-five years of age, tall slim man, over six feet high, bright mulatto complexion, black eyes and dark straight hair, and is quick spoken. He wears no whiskers, and has but little beard. He is about 28 years of age.

Andrew Strong is about 5 feet 7 inches high, thick set, full face and will weigh about 170 lbs. He is only 20 years of age, and has no beard, only a thick down on his upper lip and temples. He is nearly white, and will readily pass as such. He is not disposed to be talkative. His hair is black, with a disposition to curl; he wears it short. He has black eyes, and heavy eye-brows which nearly meet.

From Charleston. The News of yesterday morning says: "The number of deaths from yellow fever, during the past week, as shown by the daily reports of the city registrar, is 26; viz: Monday's report 3, Tuesday's report 1, Wednesday's report 3, Thursday's report 4, Friday's report 3, Saturday's report 3, Sunday's report 5. These deaths occurred on the following days: On Sunday 1, on Tuesday 5, on Wednesday 8, on Thursday 5, on Friday 4, and on Saturday 3, total 26. These figures show that the heaviest mortality, as was expected to be the case, was immediately after the sudden change in the weather from sultry warmth to damp coolness. In our last weekly report we showed that the number of deaths up to the 16th inst (including the death on that day reported by the registrar on Sunday), was 55. Adding the subsequent deaths to date, we have a total of 83 deaths this year, against 404 for the corresponding period in 1868, 96 in 1869, and 305 in 1874."

The city registrar reports 5 deaths from the prevailing disease for the twenty-four hours ending at 12 M, on Sunday, and our press telegram last night reports 5 for the twenty-four hours next ensuing.
