The cotton movement at New York for the week, as compared with the week previous, shows a slight increase in exports. The movement for the entire portion of the cotton year, however, shows a large falling off, both in receipts and exports, as compared with the corresponding period of last season.

There is an American cotton float for Great Britain of 90,000 bales last week. The amount of Indian cotton float for Europe is 338,133 against 190,000 bales last year.
