REPORTS.

From Havana. HAVANA, March 1. The journals publish the following decree, issued by Captain General Valdespina, dated at Santiago de Cuba, February 1st.

From New York. NEW YORK, March 2. A Tammany meeting has resolved upon a new election, at which an entirely new General Committee will be chosen.

From Washington. WASHINGTON, March 2. The Wisconsin Association, by a vote of 40 to 38, adopted resolutions endorsing Sumner's one term amendment to the constitution.

From Virginia. RICHMOND, March 2. The severest snow storm since 1857 is now prevailing. It has been snowing heavily for twelve hours and still continues, with the wind from the North-west blowing a hurricane and snow drifting accordingly.

From South Carolina. CHARLESTON, March 2. There was a levee Northeast: storm here last night. There was no damage in the harbor, but it is supposed to have been heavy off the coast.
