There are in North Carolina, says the Raleigh News, two hundred and twenty-one Lodges that are at work with an active membership of 8,414. Taking into account returns not received at the last meeting of the Grand Lodge and non-affiliated Masons, the whole number of Masons in the State amounts to 11,153. These were initiated during the Masonic year of 1871, 593, showing rapid increase of the order; and 131 deaths.
