"Business is very dull here at present. The country is in such a disturbed state now there is nothing doing. The deputy United States officers with troops of soldiers are scouting the country day and night arresting men everywhere. They are bringing old men, some of them of eighty and ninety years, some even on crutches, and lodging them in jail. Some of these old men, I feel satisfied, have not teen away from their homes a night for ten or twenty years. Hundreds are leaving the country because no man knows whose turn may come next. The officers will take perfectly innocent men, and throw them into prison for a length of time without preferring charges against them, and extort money out of them and then turn them loose. We have a perfect reign of terror here. Troops are under arms and galloping in every direction. This region was never in fact more quiet and peaceable than it is now. Money and politics seem to be the objects of the raid. You will scarcely see a citizen passing in the streets; and as for crops there will be very little made this year if this thing goes on any longer. I am told these' fellows get filty dollars for each arrest, which reward seems to be the great motive power. I saw them bring in some old men to-day who could hardly walk. I hope you gentlemen will be as lenient as possible; I have a good deal of money out, which I cannot collect at present."


