THIS NIGHT REPORTS.

FROM WASHINGTON. WASHINGTON, April 22. MISCELLANEOUS. The Court of Claims to-day decided certain cases involving nearly one million dollars, against the Government, which had been withheld on the provisions of Drake's amendment, which the Supreme Court decided unconstitutional.

SENATE—The Senate is engaged in the consideration of the bill relative to the night. The struggle between freer and coffee and the North Carolina Senatorial contest, resulted in favor of the contest, by a vote of 25 to 22. No action.

HOUSE—A large number of bills were introduced. The new revenue bill was read. These proceedings crowded out the usual bill-busting over-night.

From Mexico. MATAMOROS, April 22. The steamer Tabasco arrived off the mouth of the Rio Grande, from Vera Cruz, with five hundred men. There is no revolutionary spirit showing.

From Alabama. MONTGOMERY, April 22. After long litigation before Judge Woods, of the United States Circuit Court at Mobile, W. O. Drake and others, to set aside the decree of Judge Busted declaring the Alabama and Chattanooga Railroad a bankrupt, it was decided by Judge Woods last Saturday that the bankrupt proceedings were in regular form and he declined to interfere.

From South Carolina. CHARLESTON, April 22. In the U. S. District Court to-day the case of John Rodgers vs. Union County, a direct conspiracy and murder, was taken up. The Government abandoned the murder charge. The trial for conspiracy began; four witnesses were called by the Government who testified to their participation in several murders.
