The Southern Baptist Convention.

RALEIGH, May 9. The Southern Baptist Convention met today at 10 o'clock A. M. The President, Dr. Mell, of Georgia, is detained at home by sickness. The only one of the Vice-Presidents present was Rev. J. W. M. Williams of the 1st Baptist Church of Baltimore, who called the Convention to order. On taking the chair he regretted the absence of the other officers and alluded to the death of Revs. J. B. Taylor and A. M. Poindexter, of Virginia, corresponding and assistant corresponding sec-retaries of the Board of Foreign Missions, concluding in eloquent terms. After the usual preliminaries of organization had been gone through with an election for

President resulted in the choice of J. P.

Bovce, of South Carolina. The following Vice Presidents were elected : Rev. J. L. M. Curry, of Virginia ; A. P. Abell, of Georgia; A. F. Crane, of Maryland, and Prof. N. K. Davis, of Kentucky. Messrs. E. Calvin Williams, of Maryland, and T. S. Samuer, of Alabams, the present incumbents, were elected Secretaries. In the afternoon session reports from the Boards of Foreign Missions, from the Foreign, Domestic and Indian Missions and Sunday Schools were read and reterred to appropriate committees; also the reports of the Treasurer of the Convention. The report of the Board of Foreign Missions is particularly interesting. Rev. J. W. Norton, of Kentucky, was elected Treasurer of the Convention and Rev. N. Long Auditor. G. W. Bushyhead, Chief of the Cherokee Indians of this State, was introduced to the Convention, and upon representing the destitute condition of his people a collection was taken up amounting to \$39 85. Intelligence being received that Rev. Mr. Yearman, of Missouri, who had been previously chosen, could not attend, Rev. J. W. M. Williams, of Baltimore, was chosen to preach the introductory sermon to night. There are at least 250 delegates present. -Pet. Index.

Greeley Ra'ification in South Caro lina.

CHARLESTON, May 9. A large public meeting was held at Greenwood, in the upper part of the State,

Monday night, to ratify the Cincinnati nominations. Whites and blacks united in the demonstration, and speakers of both issed, as follows:

"Whereas Mr. Greeley, from boyhood to old age, has been the unrelenting champion of emancipation, the bestower of civil and religious liberty upon all mankind, and an impartial advocate of justice without regard to race or color; therefore be it resolved, that we heartily endorse the nominations of the Cincinnati Convention, and will do all that in us lies to sustain the platform adopted and in extending general amnesty."

Platform of the Woman's Suffrage Association.

NEW YORK, May 9. The platform of the woman's suffrage party, presented to-day to the association at Steinway Hall, recognizes the equality of all before the law and the constitutional amendments; demands universal suffrage and amnesty; thorough civil service reform; the one-term principle, and the election of President, Vice President and Senators by the whole people; the raising of taxes only for revenue; reform of the financial system by making the government currency legal-tender for all debts, public and private; opposes land grants to corporations; believes in minority representation and graduated taxation, in the reformation of criminals by education and humane legislation, and in the cultivation of peace with all nations, and the settlement of all international difficulties by a congress of nations.
