

The Southern Baptist Convention.

RALEIGH, May 9. The Southern Baptist Convention met today at 10 o'clock A. M. The President, Dr. M. of Georgia, is detained at home by sickness. The only one of the members present was Rev. J. W. Williams, who called the Convention to order.

On taking the chair he regretted the absence of the other officers and alluded to the death of Rev. J. B. Taylor and A. M. Poindexter, of Virginia, corresponding and assistant corresponding secretaries of the Board of Foreign Missions, respectively in eloquent terms.

Greely Re-ification in South Carolina.

CHARLESTON, May 9. A large public meeting was held at Greenwood, in the upper part of the State, Monday night, to ratify the Cincinnati nominations. Whites and blacks united in the demonstration, and speakers of both colors eulogized Mr. Greely as the original abolitionist and the friend of peace.

Platform of the Woman's Suffrage Association.

NEW YORK, May 9. The platform of the woman's suffrage party, presented to-day to the association at Stuyvesant Hall, recognizes the equality of all before the law and the constitutional amendments; demands universal suffrage and amnesty; thorough civil service reform; the one-term principle, and the election of President, Vice President and Senators by the whole people; the raising of taxes only for revenue; reform of the financial system by making the government currency legal-tender for all debts, public and private; opposes land grants to corporations; believes in minority representation and graduated taxation, in the reformation of criminals by education and humane legislation, and in the cultivation of peace with all nations, and the settlement of all international difficulties by a congress of nations.

The Electoral Vote.

Just now the politicians are figuring upon the electoral vote, both as bearing upon the Presidential election and on the action of the forthcoming Democratic convention. The following is the new apportionment on which such speculations are based:

A Serious Casting Affair.

Last night a very serious casting affair occurred at the tin and stove shop of Capt. John B. Tilden, on Main street. Two of his employes, young men named respectively William Roy and Joseph Brady; engaged in a friendly tussle or wrestle, when Brady threw Roy down. This seems to have led to an angry state of feeling and an altercation which resulted in Brady's being severely cut. The wounds are in the abdomen and are said to be of a very dangerous character. Drs. Pitman, Grey, Latham and Owen were called to attend the wounded man. They regard the injury as very grave and the issue doubtful. Brady was taken to his home at Mr. Casey's, lower end of Main street. Roy was taken into custody. The young men were on good terms and entirely friendly up to the time of the occurrence.—Lynchburg Virginian.

A Georgia Notion.
