A NORTH CAROLINA CORRUPTION FUND.

Renomination Schemes to Elect Caldwell—\$200,000 for the First Installment—The State to be Carried for Grant at all Hazards.

It is stated upon excellent authority that the United States Marshal for North Carolina left Washington yesterday for Raleigh, with \$200,000 in Government funds, drawn from the Treasury ostensibly to pay the expenses of the United States Courts.

They have a double purpose in view in those wholesale arrests. First, to obtain an electioneering fund from the fees, mileage, and expenses they can charge for serving processes; and, second, to intimidate large numbers of conservative voters in close counties.

Enormous collections of money are now making in this city and elsewhere to be sent into the State of North Carolina. The screws have been put to the office-holders and the expectants of office.

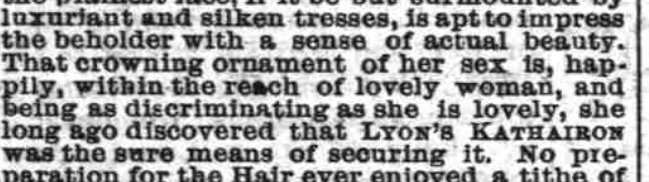
