LONDON, Sept. 9. Great satisfaction prevails among Inter-nationals here at the decision of the Hague Congress to remove the General Council from London to New York.

The Cabinet-makers and Upholsterers eight hour league dissolved yesterday. Ac-cording to the report of the finance com-mittee the recent strike ended disastrously to the funds of the league, and its officers are accused of dishonesty in the manage-


