A PROCLAMATION

BY THE Governor of North Carolina! EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, RALEIGH, March 8, 1873. WHEREAS, OFFICIAL INFORMATION HAS been received at this Department that one Sam Perry, alias Moses Perry, is charged with the crime of murder; and that he has fled the State, or so conducted himself as to obstruct the course of law cannot be served upon him;

TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS

for the arrest and delivery of said Sam Perry, alias Moses Perry, to the Sheriff of New Hanover County, that he may be tried for said offence according to the provisions of the Statute in that behalf made, and all good citizens to aid in bringing said offender to justice.

DESCRIPTION:

Sam Perry, alias Moses Perry, is described to be a dark complexioned negro, about five feet high, weighs about 160 or 170 pounds, is lame in his right leg, and has dark spots on one forehead.

Quarantine Regulations.

2D. ALL VESSELS HAVING SICKNESS ON board on arrival, or having had sickness during the voyage, are required to come to the station for inspection, without regard to the port from whence they sailed, or season of the year.

3D. VESSELS NOT INCLUDED IN ABOVE, WILL BE RECEIVED TO WILMINGTON WITHOUT DETENTION. 4th. Pilots are especially enjoined to make careful enquiry, and if not satisfied with the statements of the Captain, or if the vessel is in a filthy condition, they will bring the vessel to the station for further examination.

Quarantine Regulations.

5th. Pilots willfully violating the Quarantine Laws are subject to forfeiture of their license. Masters of Vessels to a fine of two hundred dollars a day for every day they violate the Quarantine Laws; and all other persons are liable for each and every offence.
