—Capt. Swift Galloway, of Wayne, was in the city yesterday.
—Meeting of the Board of County Commissioners to-morrow night.
—Mr. Osteen, of the *Sumter News*, has been on a brief visit to our city.
—A colored male patient was admitted to the City Hospital yesterday.
—The "bottoms" was completely out of the spirits turpentine market yesterday.

—For several days past Col. Klein has been engaged in fixing up the track of the Street Railway, and the improvement is evident, as the cars run much smoother than before.

—Mrs. Hemmingsway, of Boston, patroness of Tilton Normal School, has, we learn, arrived in this city. Mrs. H. has been on a somewhat protracted visit to Florida.

—We invite attention to the prospectus of the Raleigh Sentinel. Under the new practical management the *Sentinel* shows a marked improvement, and now ranks with our best journals.

—Wm. Soles was up before Justice Woodford yesterday on the charge of committing assault and battery on the person of Albert Marvin. The case was dismissed at the plaintiff's cost.

—Only two interments in Oakdale Cemetery during the past week. Of these one was aged 30 years and the other 10 months, and the diseases of which they died were consumption and meningitis, respectively.

Our readers can well imagine the fortitude and endurance which was requisite to sustain him through such a terrible ordeal, when hundreds of others were dropping off and perishing in the angry flood, and his only remaining companion had almost succumbed to the horrible sufferings from cold and exposure which they endured. That Capt. Vick escaped alive under all the circumstances is almost a miracle and stamps him as a man of tenacity and endurance far beyond the general run of humanity.
