MADRID.

There has been a revolutionary demonstration, if not an accomplished revolution, within the last two days at Madrid. Castelar, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Salmeron, Minister of Justice, affirmed at a cabinet meeting on Wednesday that discipline had been restored in the army and that the Carlists have been checked, but acknowledged that the situation was grave.

Texas—Its Advantages and Disadvantages.

The Bridge Disaster.

An investigation into the Richmond Switch disaster is soon over. The testimony of the road officials is all in, and the case is sealed up for the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island. This body meets next winter—a safe distance from the excitement of the disaster. The noticeable points in the evidence are two: the ruined bridge has been built nearly forty years; the railroad people would build just such another bridge in just such a place if this accident had not aroused them. The comment will be: Was it not time that the bridge should wash out? And do not the managers of the road consider it fortunate that they are now warned against building any more such bridges in similar places?

Superior Court.

Manson McDaniel and Henry Southernland were convicted in the Superior Court yesterday upon the testimony of Samuel Jordan of stealing a hog. The case occupied the larger part of two days. They were defended by Mr. A. Emple, whose closing speech we have heard spoken of in terms of very high commendation. This was the only case disposed of yesterday. We learn that the criminal docket will be finished up to-day.
