A New Scheme for the Promotion of the Commercial Prosperity of Wilmington.

This enterprise proposes the connection of the Northeast branch of the Cape Fear with New River by a canal of sufficient dimensions to permit its navigation by steamboats and rafts.

Nature seems to have pointed out the route for there is a variety of streams forming a connecting link between the two rivers. It is proposed, we learn, to leave the Northeast River at Bannerman's, either utilizing Holly Shelter Creek or following its Swamp, leaving the last named stream at the mouth of Big Sandy Run Creek, following this stream and swamp to Big Sandy Run Pocosin (the dividing ridge between the two rivers), crossing this pocosin and following down either Hawes or Troublesome Run Creek to the navigable waters of the Southwest, making a junction with New River four miles below Jacksonville.

The projectors of the scheme propose in constructing this canal to divert all available streams, including the Southwest, and if necessary the waters of the New River, through the canal, thus obviating the necessity of much excavation and as a consequence greatly lessening the cost of its construction. It is also claimed that this canal will need no locks, which is half the cost of constructing works of this sort.

The construction of this canal, it is claimed, will afford drainage to some of the richest and most valuable swamp lands in the State, and will open up boundless pine forests, valuable for timber and turpentine, and on the low lands will give an outlet for large quantities of cypress, juniper, white oak, ash and hickory, and an almost endless amount of valuable fire wood; besides which it will facilitate available and desirable steamboat communication between Onslow and adjoining counties.

As the waters of New River team with fish and among the finest oysters in the world, this connection, if made, will open them up to remunerative markets through the different railroads diverging from this city, as well as more fully supplying the demand among our own people.

We learn that the citizens of Wilmington are manifesting much interest in this enterprise and that steps are being taken that will at an early day insure a survey of the route of the proposed canal, with a view of ascertaining its feasibility, cost of construction, &c. In case the result shall prove satisfactory we shall no doubt soon have a new adjunct to the commercial interests of our rapidly growing city.

Death of James Pison.

The Raleigh papers of yesterday announce the death of this gentleman, which occurred on Thursday morning at 6 o'clock, surviving the stroke of paralysis with which he was attacked just twenty-four hours. Mr. Pison had many warm friends in this city, where he resided for several years, who will regret exceedingly to hear of the above announcement. In alluding to the occurrence the Raleigh News says: "Mr. Pison was a man of distinction, being the pioneer piano forte manufacturer in this country and a musical artist of no little merit. He possessed the esteem of all in this community who knew him, and by his kindly disposition and integrity of life secured to himself many warm friends. His death bed was surrounded by numbers of sorrowing friends who rendered him all the aid that human knowledge could suggest. A son of Mr. P.'s is expected to arrive to-day and the remains will be taken to New York for interment."

Local News.
— Showery yesterday.

— Delinquent tax payers for 1872 are notified by the City Clerk and Treasurer that all whose city taxes for that year are not paid in full on or before the 15th inst., will be proceeded with to the full extremity of the law.

— A pistol, in the hands of a colored girl, at the residence of Maj. F. D. Poisson, was accidentally discharged yesterday, the ball passing through a window and barely missing Mrs. Poisson. The pistol was the property of a colored man who sleeps on Maj. Poisson's premises, and the girl is supposed to have taken it from his room during his absence.

The Steamship *Raleigh*.
We adverted briefly in our last to the fact that the new steamship *Raleigh*, built for the Baltimore and Wilmington Steamship Line, was launched a few days ago at the former city. The *Raleigh* is a first-class steamer in every particular, and while having a large carrying capacity draws but a moderate amount of water, so as to be able to cross the Southern bars at all seasons. She is about nine hundred tons burthen, and will be rigged as a three-masted vessel. Her machinery and interior finish is to be completed as soon as possible, and she will ere long be placed on the line in connection with the other fine steamers composing it. The *Raleigh*, it is understood, will be commanded by Capt. Oliver, who superintended her construction.

To be Broken Up.
We learn that the authorities have determined to break up the den on Fifth, near the corner of Walnut street, which has long been a source of great annoyance to people residing in the neighborhood. The proprietress has been summoned to appear before the Mayor's Court this morning to answer the charge of keeping a disorderly house, and we learn that quite an array of witnesses will be present to testify in the case.
