2d. The County Commissioners, or upon their failure, the inspectors of elections shall provide for each election precinct eight ballot boxes-one for each amendment to be voted on. Each of said boxes shall have attached thereto a written or printed label, designating the amendment to be voted on therein, and after the close of the election the judges shall count out separately the number of votes cast for and against the amendment. (See chap. 153, Acts 1872-'73,

We would suggest the following as the form of one of the tickets:

Amendment to N. C. Constitution in relation to the Public Debt, (chap .85, Acts 1872-'73. "For Amend ment" (or when desired) say "Against Amendment."

Of course each ticket must be prepared to suit each amendment, of which there are eight.
