Lieut. W. H. Bailey, of the U. S. Revenue Cutter W. H. Crawford, now on this station, has been promoted to a captaincy and has received his commission.

Two rare specimens of the finny tribe were subjected to our inspection on Monday, which were caught on the rocks at Masonboro Sound by Mr. John J. Hewlett. There are what is known as the trigger-fish and the genuine gold fish, both indigenous to our waters.

[For the Wilmington Star.] In your issue of the 12th inst., I see an account of the unfortunate homicide at Mullins, S. C., which was evidently given by some one who knew but little of the true circumstances of the affair. Justice to the lamented dead demands that the incorrect statements and impressions therein contained be corrected through the same medium.

There was a picnic at Mullins' Depot on the evening of the 8th inst., but Mr. D. P. Higgs, the unfortunate victim, had no connection whatever with it, nor did the picnic have anything to do with the fatal affray. The assault was entirely unprovoked on the part of young Higgs. He, in company with two young men, was spending the evening quietly at his place of business. Young Gilchrist, who was under the influence of liquor, came down to the depot and for no apparent cause began to curse Mr. H. in a manner so riotous and abusive that he was forced to resent it. The statement that young Higgs "had been drinking and walked in to the store in front of which they had been standing to get another drink, after which he came out, walked up to Gilchrist and struck him a severe blow, knocking him down," is totally at variance with the true statement of the case—first, because Higgs was standing on his own piazza when attacked by Gilchrist, secondly, because it can be proven by men of high moral character and veracity who transacted business with Higgs a few minutes before the affray, that there was no evidence or smell of liquor about the young man; and, thirdly, because Gilchrist never was under the influence of liquor, and was not drunk at all, having received no blow severer than one stroke from Higgs' hand. In the commencement of the affray Higgs was assisted by one Reamer, a telegraph operator from Marion, who dealt Higgs two severe blows with something in his hand on the back of his head, which stunned him, and after Reamer was taken off of Higgs and Higgs recovering himself from the ground, Gilchrist struck him one or more times with a piece of scantling two feet eight inches long and one and a quarter inches thick, which is supposed to have inflicted the fatal blow.

Mr. Higgs was seen to take one drink after he had been so severely wounded. There was no intimacy existing between the parties for some time past, and both young men were of age.

Gilchrist never was arrested. He gave bail after the verdict of the coroner's jury. Mr. Higgs has been but a few months in this community, and was universally esteemed and regarded as a quiet, law-abiding citizen. C. F. McDANIEL.

The youth attempted to jump upon the train, but slipping, thus met his untimely death.

Two of the shots took effect in the back and one in the head. Allman succeeded in getting loose and retreated back to Webster, from which place our informant writes.

A correspondent of the Newbernian gives some account of the discussion last Saturday at Beaufort between Dr. Martin, the Conservative nominee for the Senate in Carteret, and Applegate, the Radical independent, who is running in Radical interests. The excitement was intense.
