Goldboro Record: We hear a rumor that Sheriff Murrell, of Onslow county, while attempting to arrest two negroes under legal process, in that county, shot and severely wounded both, arresting one and the other escaping, under the following circumstances, which fully justify him.

When he told the negroes that he had a pistol and that they were under arrest, one of them drew a pistol and presenting it to the Sheriff, attempted to shoot, but the piece missed fire, whereupon the Sheriff shot and wounded him. The other negro also drew a pistol, but the Sheriff shot and wounded him before he could attempt to fire. The negroes attempted to escape, and one succeeded, while the other was captured.
