D., 1868, has been, or hereafter shall be. convicted of treason, perjury, forgery, larceny, or any other crime, infamous by the laws of this State at the time of the commission thereof, or of corruption or mal-practice in office, shall be eligible to office or to a seat in either house of the General Assembly, or be competent or allowed to vote or be a jaror, unless he shall have been legally relieved of such disabilities."
