



Magistrates' Court. Our litigation began in 1850, but it was not until 1852 that I secured a verdict against him, granting me a full divorce, with \$3,000 . a year alimony, subsequently raised to \$4,000. During this period he refused me any support; when the verdict was obtained he appealed against it, without the alimony and contesting its payment at every point and on every legal quibble, through all the Courts up to the Court of Appeals. It was not until 1862, ten years after verdict, that I secured the final and unanimous opinion of the Court of Appeals in my favor. It is a great satisfaction to me to recall that through way, at no stage of it, nor in any Court, a single accision adverse to me.
