OUR TALKS.

The strike in the Durham collieries is virtually ended. King of Belgium writes to the Pope that he regrets impending discussions in the country on proposed revision of educational law.

The President issued proclamation against evil-doers who propose to invade Indian territory. Mr. Ewing, of Ohio, made a telling speech in the House yesterday.

Mr. Morrill has purchased a large number of the best Lexington colts on Mr. Welsh's stock farm near Philadelphia.

Rev. Francis M. Baker, of the Episcopal Church, in his 57th year, died suddenly in Richmond on the 25th of paralysis.

Blaine, in his second speech, was very hard on South Carolina. This was his second offence within a few days. Senator Butler is reported as giving him some very plain talk.

Conkling announced that he would make a few remarks on the army bill. He only spoke three hours. If he had only "made the greatest speech of his life," which he has long promised, he would have probably spoken an entire week.
