WILMINGTON. Its Size, Population and Importance as a Commercial Mart—Its Early History—Its Churches, Cemeteries, Surrounding Scenery, &c.—The Composition of a School Girl.

In our issue of the 2nd inst. we mentioned, under the head of "A Good Idea," the fact that the teachers in one of our city schools had required the scholars to write a composition on Wilmington, and indulged in such reflections as the subject had impressed upon their minds.

Wilmington, the largest and principal business metropolis in the State of North Carolina, is situated on the east bank of the Cape Fear river, about twenty-eight miles from its mouth.

The climate of Wilmington is noted for its health and salubrity, which is greatly improved by the refreshing sea-breezes from the south and east.

Wilmington was first called Newton. The name was changed to Wilmington in the year 1789. It was named in honor of Spencer Compton, the Earl of Wilmington.

The first church built in Wilmington was St. James', which parish included the whole of New Hanover county, and was torn down in 1839 to be replaced by the present handsome building.

The first newspaper ever published in this section was called the North Carolina Gazette. It was issued in the year 1764.
