CITY AFFAIRS.

The New Board Meet for Re-Organization—Election of Col. W. L. Smith Mayor—The Other City Officers.

In accordance with adjournment, the new Board of Aldermen met at the City Hall yesterday afternoon.

The meeting was called to order at 3:30 o'clock by ex-Mayor Fishblade.

Alderman Chadbourne, in a very neat and complimentary speech, nominated Alderman Bowden.

Alderman Bowden stated the nomination placed him in a bad position.

Alderman Smith opposed the motion and argued immediate action.

Alderman Bowden explained and finally withdrew the motion to postpone.

The Chairman appointed Alderman Worth and Chadbourne Tellers.

A ballot was then taken and resulted as follows: Smith 6, Bowden 4.

Ex-Mayor Fishblade then very gracefully retired from the chair.
