Death of David S. Sanders. Mr. David S. Sanders, one of the oldest white citizens of the county, died at his residence near Castle Haynes, about eight miles from this place, after a lingering illness, yesterday morning. Mr. Sanders came to this county from Onslow somewhere in the neighborhood of 1824 or 1825, and resided for some time at Topsail Sound. He was a very successful peanut planter and was always engaged prominently in agricultural pursuits. He served some years ago, and very acceptably, as one of the Democratic members of the Board of County Commissioners for this county, and in all the relations of life he has been esteemed for his many good qualities. Deceased was about 73 years of age, and was a half brother of the William Mumford who was hung at New Orleans by order of Gen. Butler, and which created such a stir throughout the South at the time of the most disgraceful occurrences of the late war.

The Race Friday. The September Regatta of the Carolina Yacht Club, the last of the season, took place over the course at Wrightsville on Friday last, and was won by the yacht 'Beetles'. On account of the scarcity of 'able seamen' present, it was impossible to man all the yachts, and it was decided by the captain of the 'Beetles', 'Beetles' and 'Glide', the three boats entering, to have two of them race, and then let the winner give the remaining boat a start. In accordance with this agreement the 'Beetles', Capt. Norwood Giles, and the 'Beetles', Capt. S. P. Cowan, raced first, and the 'Beetles' was victorious by one minute. The 'Beetles' was then pitted against the champion flag, which she had so gallantly carried, taking it from the 'Beetles', in whose possession it had been for exactly one year, she having won it at the September race, 1880.

Accused of Murder. A "postal" from Deputy Sheriff Melver, of Robeson county, informs the Sheriff of New Hanover that one Lucien Simpson is in jail in Lumberton on the charge of murdering a woman in this county some time ago, and requesting the Sheriff to inquire into the facts at once, and advise the Sheriff of Robeson of the result, as Simpson may soon be released on the charges there. The authorities here have heard of no such murder having been committed, and their inquiries have failed to elicit any information on the subject.
