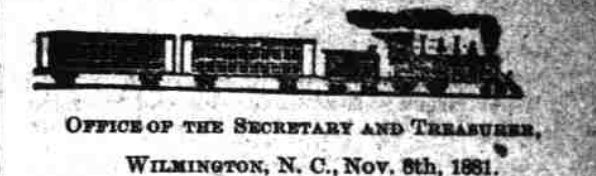
PROCLAMATION! We regret to hear that typhoid fever is quite prevalent at Clinton and in the vicinity.
