

The decrease is 11,980 bales. -A delegation of North Carolina Republicans called at the White House at Washington on Thursday, to talk with the President on political matters in this State. Jas. H. Harris, colored, was the spokesman. The fourth United States Internal Revenue Collection District, of which Col. I. J. Young is Collector, is composed of the following counties: Chatham, Franklin. Granville, Johnston, Nash, Durham, Henderson, Orange, Wake, Warren, Anson, Bladen, Brunswick, Columbus, Cumberland, Harnett, Montgomery, Moore, New Hanover, Richmond, Robeson, Sampson and Stanly, The State was divided into seven collection districts February 27, 1866. The First Dis-trict was abolished and consolidated with the Second on January 1, 1876. The Third District was abolished and consolidated with the Fourth February 1, 1876. The Seventh District was abolished and consoli-dated with the Sixth January 1, 1877.


