Notice. To Liquor Dealers. CITY OF WILMINGTON, N. C. MAYOR'S OFFICE. November 3, 1882.

THE ATTENTION OF LIQUOR DEALERS IS called to the following law of the State of North Carolina: "No person or persons shall give away, in any public place, retail or sell, except upon the prescription of a practicing physician, and for medicinal purposes, any intoxicating liquors at any time within twelve hours next preceding or succeeding any public election, or during the holding thereof, at any place within five miles of any election precinct."

"Any person or persons violating the provisions of the preceding section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and punishable with a fine of not less than one hundred nor more than one thousand dollars."—Battle's Revision, Sections 149 and 150.

Notice is hereby given that, in accordance with the above law, all Bar-Rooms and places where intoxicating liquors are sold, shall be closed at 6 P. M., on Monday, November 6th, and remain closed until 6 o'clock A. M., on Wednesday, November 8th.

Any violation of the above law at the ensuing election, on the 7th of November, 1882, will be vigorously prosecuted.
