— Eighth Sunday after Trinity. — Receipts of cotton yesterday 16 bales. — Day's length 14 hours and 19 minutes. — Seven prisoners in the guard house yesterday. — Methodist Quarterly Meeting at Smithville to-day. — Thus far 331 dog badges have been disposed of. — There are now fourteen prisoners in the county jail. — Eggs were retailing yesterday at 15 cents per dozen. — A big crowd went down to the Sound yesterday afternoon. — There will be no services in the First Baptist Church to-night. — Watermelons retailed yesterday at from ten to thirty cents a piece. — Shrimps were retailing at from 5 to 10 cents per quart yesterday. — A valuable horse belonging to Messrs. Worth & Worth died Friday night. — The thermometer reached as high as 80 degrees yesterday in the STAR office. — The open air protracted meeting at Hilton, under Rev. Oscar Miller, colored, is said to be a success. — Whortleberries still continue to arrive in considerable quantities, and retail at from 5 to 8 cents per quart. — Mr. David A. Chadwick has opened a store for the sale of tobacco, cigars, and liquors at No. 15 North Market street. — A very encouraging and interesting exhibit of the sinking fund of the city is given in our advertising columns this morning. — The Register of Deeds issued three marriage licenses during the past week, of which one was to white and two to colored couples. — The receipts of cotton during the week closing yesterday footed up 23 bales, as against 22 bales for the corresponding week last year. — The French flag was displayed by Mr. Jacob Leob, French Vice Consul, yesterday, in honor of the destruction of the Bastille in Paris, in 1789. — The muskets for the Smithville Light Infantry were expected to arrive from Raleigh last evening, and will be forwarded to Smithville on Monday. — Don't forget the excursion on the steamer Passport, on Thursday, under the auspices of the Young Catholic Friends' Society.
