Queen Victoria dedicates her new book "To my loyal Highlanders" A dispatch to the New York Herald says: "In all personal references the Queen invariably uses the plural number. Our beloved daughter Beatrice, 'Our beloved uncle, the Emperor of Germany,' 'Our deeply lamented daughter Alice' receive frequent allusion. There is scant reference to the Prince of Wales. Only once, in fact, does she speak of him at any length. This was on the occasion of his severe illness from typhoid fever. The Queen makes long comments upon political events, and gives many opinions on men of the times. She expresses an especially high estimate of Lord Beaconsfield. She discloses Beconsfield's views on the results of the general election of 1880, and also his ideas on the foreign situation about the time of his death. In a manifest preference for the ideas of the departed statesman, there is an obvious implication of criticism of the policy of Mr. Gladstone. In another part of the book the Queen gives an account of the growth of the friendship between herself and the Emperor of Austria after the fall of Napoleon. The Queen professes to hold the character of Napoleon, especially under misfortune, in very high estimation. The book, as a whole, refers less to the Queen's domestic life than was anticipated.
