Thorpe, Director of the Arion Musical Society, of this city, sends us a prospectus and programme of the third annual Musical Convention and Festival for Virginia and North Carolina, to be held in Petersburg, Va., May 26th, 27th, 28th and 29th, 1884. Mr. H. Noltenius, Chairman of the Committee on Music, writes Mr. Thorpe that he has reserved two seats at the Festival for delegates from Wilmington, and has also sent one hundred copies of the prospectus and programme to be distributed among the musical people here. For the past two years Mr. Thorpe has been urged by Noltenius to form a branch society in Wilmington, and it is his intention to do so next winter, and if possible to train a large chorus to take part in the Festival next season. Such a society would no doubt result in benefit to Wilmington, and especially would this be the case should it grow in size and importance sufficiently to warrant a series of concerts by the combined forces of the association in this city, which would give pleasure to our people and bring a large concourse of visitors to Wilmington, as it now does to Petersburg. Mr. Thorpe will be encouraged in his design and efforts to establish such a society here, and in promoting a taste for good music among our people.

Death of Mr. Henry Burkholder. Mr. Henry Burkholder, the old and well known tobacconist of this city, died yesterday afternoon, about 3 o'clock, of disease of the heart. He had been sick for a week or two, but was only confined to his bed for a few days. Deceased was a native of Chester, Pennsylvania. He came to this city in 1844, and has ever since been engaged in the tobacco business, having occupied his present store since 1846. His sister was married to Mr. Elijah Dickinson, at one time at the head of one of the heaviest commission houses in the then town of Wilmington. Mr. Burkholder-Harry Burkholder he was familiarly called—was a man of warm, generous impulses, and had many friends in the community who will regret to hear that he has been summoned hence. He was aged 66 years. The funeral will take place this (Sunday) afternoon, at 3 30 o'clock, from his late residence.

She found articles of clothing scattered promiscuously about the floor and some \$1 or \$2 in money missing.
