Gov. Cleveland was driven to the Pierpont House, on Montague street, where a large number of people awaited his arrival.

Hundreds more awaited their turn to grasp Gov. Cleveland's hand, but time did not permit it, and he was escorted from the Academy, and once more took his seat in his carriage.
