The foreign exports yesterday comprised 1,100 casks spirits turpentine and 8,300 bbis. rosin, valued at \$33,000, for Hull, Eng., by Messrs. Alex. Sprunt & Son; and 3,000 bbis. rosin, valued at \$3,647, for Glasgow, Scotland, by Messrs. Paterson, Downie & Co.

Judge Seymour yesterday sent down a decree in favor of the libellant in the case of Edward Thomas, libellant, against the schooner Alice Hearn for seaman's wages. This was a case that excited some interest in maritime circles, and the decision has settled a doubtful point.

Thomas is a seaman and was employed as such on the schooner Alice Hearn. After the arrival of the vessel in the port of Wilmington, Thomas came on shore, at night intending to return; but got into a disturbance while drinking, and was locked up by the police.
