SUPREME COURT; DECISIONS

Raleigh News-Observer. Rogers. ex., vs. Clements.

Where there are two co-obligor on single bond on which the presumption of payment has arisen, such presumption cannot be rebutted so as to charge one of the obligors by the naked admission of the other that the bond had not been paid, made in the absence of the obligor sought to be charged. Such admissions with regard to single bonds are held to be within the scope of section 22, chapter 65, Revised Code, as such bonds are declared to be, along with promisery notes, on a footing with inland bills of exchange, and are treated as mere promisory notes under seal .-Pearsall vs. Houston, 3 Jones, 346, approved.

A judgment taken by default against one co-obligor can have no greater effect than an admission to charge the other obligor.

Green vs. Griffin. An interlocutory order or restraint had been made from which Griffin appealed, and then disregarding it, he was fined for contempt, and from this he also appealed. On this last appeal the Supreme Court affirmed the judgment, after which judgment of the Supreme Court, Griffin applied to the Superior Court to modify or remit the fine which the judge declined to do for the want of power, and Griffin again appealed.

The present appeal thus raises the question of the legal power of a subsequent court, after an affirmance of the judgment from which the first appeal was taken to modify or re-

move the imposed penalty. Held: That without deciding how far a suceeeding judge may modify the terms of the order in conducting Richmond-September 19, 2 weeks. the cause, yet after an appeal he has no power to do so.

OUR STATE CONTEMPORARIES.

The people of Eastern Carolina have about made up their minds to have some part in the general development of this State. We have borne these things about long enough. We appreciate the aid of the West in political matters; but the obligation has been considerably lessened by their repeated refereuce to it, and by the material capital which they have made out of it. - Goldsboro Argus.

We do not propose in what has been said to read anybody out of the Democratic ranks ourselves, but if professed Democrats prefer to affiliate with the Republican party in its protection crusade against the people and their paramount interests, that is their own fault simply, and perhaps our misfortune. They thereby read themselves out, of their own free will and accord, so far at least as this radical measure of protection is concerned. For just as sure as certainty itself, the Republican doctrine of protection" to certain favored interests, at the expense of all other interests in the country, is not Democratic doctrine, and cannot be, in the very nature of things, without rendering the term democracy itself a misnomer—a palpable contradiction in terms.—Reidsville Times.

The Wilmington STAR, the ablest and soundest paper in the State, is very zealously in favor of educating the people. So is the Democrat. The STAR urges increased school facilities and increased school terms. Both we ought to have, or we ought to stop the schools altogether.
