The Board of Audit and Finance met in regular session yesterday afternoon. Present, Mr. R. J. Jones, chairman, and Messrs. W. I. Gore, J. F. Maunier and Jno. W. Hewitt.

WHEREAS, A tax of \$2.00 on the \$100 valuation of the real and personal property of the citizens was levied for the year 1888, and in said levy twenty-five cents on the \$100 of valuation was included for the purpose of paying the interest on the city's subscription to the stock of the Wilmington, Onslow and East Carolina railroad and the Cape Fear and Yadkin Valley railroad, and it now appears that such interest will not be required to be paid during the current year, therefore, it is hereby recommended to the Board of Aldermen that the city levy for the current year be reduced one-eighth, making the tax levy the same as that of last year.

On Mr. Gore's motion, the resolution was adopted, unanimously. The ordinance levying a tax of \$25 per month on 'ticket scalpers,' as adopted by the Board of Aldermen, was laid before the Board.
