A (cleatial Visitor.

The recently discovered comet will soon be visible in this latitude. When seen by Prof. Davidson, of Queensland, Australia on the 21st instant. its position was right ascension 12 hours 46 minutes, declination south \$2; degrees. Its motion is rapidly northeast, equal to over three degrees a day, which will bring it to the celestial equator about the end of the month. Its motion indicates nearness to the sun, and its direction shows that it has completed its circuit of that orb and is now on its return to space. It is probably approaching the earth, and as it is described as a "bright" comet, it may possibly be seen with the naked eye. Observers hunting for the celestial visitor should direct their attention to the southwest horizon, in the constellation of Virgo, where the comet
