NORTH CAROLINA CONFERENCE.

Fifty-fourth Session—Convened in the Methodist Church at Wilson—Opening Proceedings—Reports, Committees, etc.

Wilson, N. C., Dec. 10th, 1890. The 54th session of the North Carolina Conference convened in the Methodist Church this morning at 9 1/2 o'clock, Bishop John C. Keener in the chair.

After religious services conducted by the Bishop, Hon. D. W. Bain was elected Secretary.

N. M. Journey, W. L. Cunningham, W. W. Rose, Geo. F. Simmons, W. H. Branson, J. H. Southgate and R. B. John, were elected assistant secretaries.

Messrs. Barbee and Smith of the M. E. Church, South, made quite a gratifying report of the condition of the Publishing House. The volume of business the past year amounted to \$384,000; a net increase over last year of \$83,390.

Rev. W. S. Chaffin, the oldest member on the effective list, was requested to preach a semi-centennial sermon. The report of the Sunday School Editor, W. G. E. Cunningham, shows the Sunday Schools to be in fine condition, as will be seen by the following figures: Schools 13,300; teachers 89,183; scholars 695,312, and 8,077 scholars in foreign fields—making a total of 793,472.

The following were referred to the Committee on Conference Relations: J. W. Avent, J. F. Keerans, Thos. B. Reeks, R. O. Burton, Geo. E. Wyche, M. C. Thomas, N. A. Hooker, Thos. C. McGrip.

Question 10 was taken up: What local preachers are elected deacons? Answer: Gray Culbreth, J. J. Harley and Joseph Dixon.

Questions 2 and 7 were then called and were answered as follows: Question 2: Who remain on trial? Answer: M. W. Hicks, R. H. Browne, R. F. Taylor, Wm. F. Galloway, Asa J. Parker and Henderson Cole.

Question 7: Who are the deacons of one year? Answer: N. R. Richardson, H. M. Jackson, John R. Sawyer, L. W. Chaffin, J. G. Nelson, James G. Johnson and W. H. Duckett.

R. H. Whitaker was elected a local elder. Rev. W. B. Doub was granted a leave of absence.

The following Committee on Memoirs was appointed by the bishop: W. S. Black, P. L. Reid, C. W. Byrd, J. B. Martin, E. A. Yates and J. A. Cunningham.

After announcements the Conference adjourned with the benediction by the bishop. J. H. H.
