

ARTIFICIAL IVORY.

No More Need for Elephant's Tusks. A patent has been recently taken out for a process for manufacturing an artificial ivory out of the same materials which enter into the structure of the natural ivory. By this process quicklime is first treated with sufficient water to convert it into the hydrate, but before it has become completely hydrated or "slaked" an aqueous solution of phosphoric acid is poured on to it; and while stirring the mixture the calcium carbonate, magnesia and alumina are incorporated in small quantities at a time; and lastly the gelatine and albumen, melted in water, are added. The point to aim at is to obtain a compost sufficiently plastic and as intimately mixed as possible. It is then set aside to allow the phosphoric acid to complete its action upon the chalk. The following day the mixture, while still plastic, is pressed into BURNS HOUSE, the desired form in molds and dried in a current of air at a temperature of about 150°C. To complete the preparation of the artificial product by this process it is kept for three or four weeks, during which time it becomes perfectly hard.




