In conversation with a STAR reporter yesterday a gentleman from Winston, who has for years been identified with the tobacco manufacturing industry of that city, remarked that Eastern North Carolina was the ideal section for the cultivation of yellow leaf tobacco, that the soil was better adapted to it, would yield more per acre than the soil in other tobacco growing sections of the State would, and that it could be produced so much more cheaply that the growers in the upper tobacco belt would be forced to abandon its culture and confine themselves to the growing of the other kinds, for which the soil is better suited. He also stated that while this was true of Eastern North Carolina as a whole, the very best section for the cultivation of the light yellow leaf was between Wilmington and Mount Olive, on light lands which are not highly valued for any other crop, and that if the proper effort was made to introduce the culture in this area Wilmington might become a great tobacco shipping point and handle vast quantities of the weed.	deliver their papers.
