STORM STRUCK THE LAYTON COMPANY HARD in Elizabeth City Friday. In the account of Friday's storm at Elizabeth City, the regular correspondent of the Norfolk Virginian Pilot says:

"At the carnival grounds the scene is one of utter devastation and ruin. No one is seen except a few of the white people, and the place is deserted, as well as ruined. The flimsy canvas tents are mere pigmies in the giant hands of the storm..."
