## SPIRITS TURPENTINE.

Dr. Thomas Hill, aged 74 years, died at Goldsboro on Sunday night. He had been in bad health some time. Dr. Hill was a native of Samson county and was a surgeon in the Confederate army.

Rockingham is to have a new mammoth cotton mill with R. A. Little, of Little Rock, Ark., as president, Ansonville, N. C.; Robert L. Steele, W. B. Cole, H. C. Watson, M. H. Fowlkes, George P. Entwistle, of Rockingham, and others as incorporators. The charter will be obtained at once and work pushed as rapidly as possible.

John Newson, aged 28 years, of Tobaccoville, a white laborer employed by the Southern Railway at Winston-Salem in the operation of a large steam shovel, was instantly killed Monday afternoon by the collapse of a bridge, the braces of which had been undermined by the operations. He was buried under eight tons of dirt, his body being horribly crushed. He leaves a wife and one child.

Dunn correspondence, Feb. 19th: The entire plants and machinery of the Oregon Chair Company and the Dunn Safe & Table Company were sold to-day by H. L. Cowdin and C. Clifford, receivers, to Messrs. Newberry Bros. and Cowell, of this place at \$75,000. This sale is of considerable importance to furniture dealers as these plants are now to be operated by successful and thoroughly competent and experienced furniture men, and success is assured. These plants are equipped with the latest improved machinery and the location on the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad could not well be improved. These plants will be started at once and run in connection with the large furniture plant now in operation by Newberry Bros. and Cowell.

A dispatch from Winston-Salem on Monday says: The fight of Blackburn against Holton assumed a rather serious character to-day when a civil judgment was rendered in Forsyth Superior Court against Mr. Holton as surety for Blackburn for \$500, money used by Blackburn in his campaign in the eighth district. District Attorney Holton left this afternoon for Asheville, where court convenes to-morrow. Several prominent men from Wilkes and other Western counties who had headed the same way, having been subpoenaed. They were wondering what it all means. Mr. Holton was the only one who knew, and he was reticent. Asked what he was going to do in a bill of indictment against Congressman Blackburn, he replied, "if I find he has violated the law, I will do my duty, that's all."

Winston-Salem special to Charlotte Observer, Feb. 19th: The battle royal between District Attorney Holton, of the western district of North Carolina, and the indicted revenue officers will possibly culminate in Asheville this week when a bill of indictment will be sent against some of the most prominent men of the State. It is stated that the district attorney has been asked to send in a bill against Congressman E. Spencer Blackburn, of the eighth district, for violations of the same variety that have doomed Senators Mitchell and Burton. Whether or not Holton will follow his orders in a matter of speculation, many believing that Blackburn's antagonizing the Senate's confirmation of Holton's re-appointment will make an indictment seem like revenge on Holton's part, but there are those who believe Mr. Holton will carry out his orders in spite of such criticism.

Mr. T. J. Pence writes from Washington that President Roosevelt has held up the nomination of Claude Dockery to be marshal of the eastern district which is pending before the Senate Judiciary committee, where it was referred after being sent to the Senate. The nomination was withdrawn, but the President has asked the committee not to take action until word comes from the White House. The action of the executive is believed to be the result of a fight that is being made on Mr. Dockery by his uncle, Col. H. C. Dockery, the present marshal. Col. Dockery made numerous charges against his nephew, which in substance:

allege that he was in league with liquor interests in the East. The President's action in holding up the nomination indicates that an investigation is being made, and it may be that a special officer will be sent to Raleigh to report on the situation as was the case in the District Attorneyship and marshalship in the West.

The Concord special, February 19th: The case of his fight against Susie Hannon came up for this morning at 10 o'clock before Mayor J. B. Caldwell. The State was represented by L. T. Hartsell, Esq., and the girl by H. G. Means, Esq. The State's witness showed that, on coming back the second time to the Hannon house, Slack, the young man who was killed, told to leave the house but, instead of going, he went to a window. The girl told him to leave or she would kill him. Before giving him time to leave she shot through the window, hitting him in the breast. He fell in the arms of his father, Charles Ritz, dead. The girl is only 13 years of age, a mere child, yet she seemed old in crime. The mayor bound her over to court in a \$500 bond, in default of which she was taken to jail. Her father was released. Slack's remains were taken to Greensboro, the home of his wife. Public sentiment holds the faith of the girl more to blame than the slayer. Her attorney made who does not know any better, it seems. The courts will probably not find her guilty of anything more than manslaughter. The attorney made who seems to have had quite a checkered career and the knowledge that he had a married man shows that he had no business about such a house.
