

SPIRITS TURPENTINE

Gov. Glenn was one of the speakers at a Y. M. C. A. banquet at Charlotte Tuesday night.

Walter Hedgepeth who on Saturday stabbed young Church to death at High Point and escaped, was captured at Keenersville on Tuesday. His brother, Will Hedgepeth, was arrested at Greensboro. Church was a native of New York.

Raleigh, Jan. 21: A fine of \$50 was imposed upon the Southern Railway here for its failure to provide automatic gates at the railway crossings in the city. While other places all over the country have had such gates for a great many years, Raleigh has not had them until within a few months past, when the Seaboard put them up, but the Southern has never made any provisions of the kind. The latter road appeals from the fine.

Elizabeth City, Jan. 21.—In the Superior Court in the case of Berry against J. C. Spence, register of deeds, a judgment in the sum of \$200 was rendered by the jury today against Mr. Spence. The suit grew out of the issuing of a marriage license for Berry's daughter, over a year ago. She was under 18 years old and Mr. Berry sued to recover the penalty, saying that Mr. Spence did not exercise the legal degree of caution required by law. Probably the case will be appealed to the Supreme Court.

Raleigh, Jan. 21.—Before Judge Purmel there was a hearing in 22 suits against the Cape Fear Power Company, which owns the Buckhorn Falls Electric Power Plant on the Cape Fear river, these being for alleged damages by the overflow of land by back water, due to the great dam of that company. The plaintiffs were represented by J. A. Long and T. M. Argo, who made a motion to remand the suits to the State courts. This motion was resisted by Womack & Hayes, James E. Shepherd and R. T. Gray. The motion was denied.

Kinston, Jan. 21.—Fire in the Fridgen building this afternoon did about \$4,000 damage to the building and the stock of goods in it. The fire was discovered on the second floor in a room used for storage. It probably caught from burning soot from another chimney dropping down the flue. The contents of the storage room was entirely burned and considerable damage was done to the building and the telephone exchange in the next suite of rooms. The stock of Denmark, the jeweler, was damaged by removal and water. All loss is fully covered by insurance.

Charlotte Observer, Jan. 22. The contract for the hydraulic machinery to be used in the equipment of the Ninety-Nine Islands station, near Gaffney, S. C., has been let by the Southern Power Company to the Allis-Chalmers Company, of Milwaukee, Wis. The amount involved will approximate \$125,000. Deliveries are to be made in six, seven, eight and twelve months. The contract for the water wheels for the Rocky Creek station near Great Falls, S. C., will be announced in a few days. The amount of the two contracts will figure somewhere near \$300,000. The announcement has been made officially that no more big contracts for power against the Great Falls station will be made. With the exception of a few thousand horse power which is being reserved for small customers, the entire output has already been sold. Prospective customers will now have to wait until either the Ninety-Nine Islands or the Rocky Creek station is completed.
