LIGHT BROWN HAIR, CROWN OF HEAD BALD, FACE CLEAN SHAVEN, DESCRIPTION OF TEETH: UPPER TEETH HAD MANY GOLD FILLINGS; LEFT LATERAL INCISOR HAD A PORCELAIN FACED CROWN. RIGHT SIDE HAD A BRIDGE WITH THE FACING OF PORCELAIN ON THE SEC. OND BICUSPID GONE. LOWER TEETH: HE WORE A GOLD PARTIAL PLATE HAVING A BLOCK OF TWO MOLAR TEETH ON EACH SIDE. IN HIS POCKET WAS A SMALL OPEN FACED GOLD WATCH MADE BY PATEK PHILLIPE & CO., GENEVA. CASE AND WORKS, NO. 73,180. INSIDE OF CASE HAD JEWELER'S REGISTER MARK SCRATCHED ON-V 2077. THIS WATCH BORE THE NAME OF MARCUS & CO., UPON ITS FACE AND UPON ONE OF THE BRIDGES IN THE WORKS. IT WAS ENGRAVED WITH AN ENTWINED CIPHER MONO-GRAM CONTAINING THE LETTERS E. C. W. ON THE BACK. THIS MONOGRAM WAS QUITE SMALL, ABOUT THE SIZE OF A DIME. THERE WERE PROBABLY ONE OR 'MORE RINGS UPON HIS FINGERS OR IN HIS POCKETS.
