Surprise Marriage in Official Family. Incipient Strike by Carpenters. Restail Merchants' Association-The State Club.

(Special Star Correspondence.) Raleigh, N. C., June 9-There was an agreeable surprise on every hand here this morning as the news spread around that Mr. W. S. Wilson, corporation clerk to the Secretary of State, and Mrs. Mary Strong Calvert, one of Raleigh's most cultured and highly esteemed ladies were married.

The marriage was a complete surprise to even their most intimate friends and took place last night at the home of Mrs. Calvert's sister, Mrs. Carrie Strong, Dr. I. McK. Pittinger, rector of The Church of the Good Shepherd officiating. Mr. and Mrs. Wilson were at home to their friends today and there was a constant stream of callers extending hearty good wishes.
