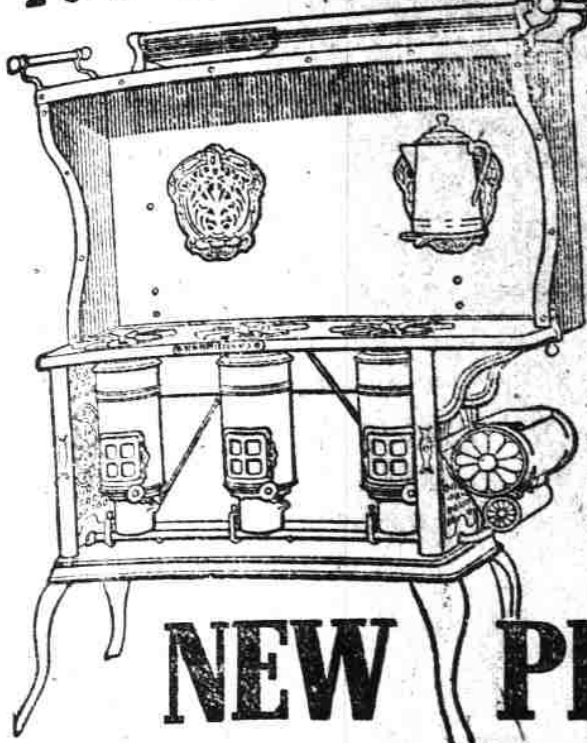

DAY'S DOINGS IN RALEIGH

Surprise Marriage in Official Family. Incipient Strike by Carpenters. Retail Merchants' Association—The State Club.

(Special Star Correspondence.) Raleigh, N. C., June 9—There was an agreeable surprise on every hand here this morning as the news spread around that Mr. W. S. Wilson, corporation clerk to the Secretary of State, and Mrs. Mary Strong Calvert, one of Raleigh's most cultured and highly esteemed ladies were married.

The marriage was a complete surprise to even their most intimate friends and took place last night at the home of Mrs. Calvert's sister, Mrs. Carrie Strong, Dr. I. McK. Pittinger, rector of The Church of the Good Shepherd officiating. Mr. and Mrs. Wilson were at home to their friends today and there was a constant stream of callers extending hearty good wishes.

The Raleigh Merchants' Association has determined to bring the 1910 convention of the State Federation of Merchants' Associations to Raleigh and has appointed a special delegation to go to the 1909 convention in Elizabeth City June 15th and make the fight for Raleigh.

The Stephens Construction Company, of Wilmington, had an incipient strike on its hands last evening that was quickly settled, however by the company acceding to the demands of the striking carpenters. It has been difficult to get all the carpenters needed for some time and several pressing contracts constrained the Stephens Company, to engage a number of negro carpenters and send them to work on a building in West Raleigh where a large number of white carpenters were at work. When the negroes came on the trouble began. There were conferences among the white carpenters and pretty soon these all left their work and began packing their tools. The foreman was informed that they would not work with the negroes. The uptown office was communicated with. Manager Gerken and others came on the scene. The negroes were paid off and told to go and the trouble was all over.

Colonel Fred A. Olds, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, left this afternoon for Columbia with Mr. Leonard Tufts, the Southern Pines millionaire, for Columbia to attend a big meeting there in the interest of the great New York-Atlanta automobile highway, their effort being especially to insure the passage of the highway through the various State capitals. Col. Olds is for the Raleigh Chamber working up the interest among the officers of the counties in North Carolina that would be traversed if the "Capitals route" is ultimately successful. He says the responses are especially encouraging, it being established that there will be very little expense of the road construction to come out of the general fund since the counties will set about putting the roads in order for themselves.

"The State Club" is now fully organized and established in its club house on the west side of Capital Square, it being a club of state officials and their friends. The Woman's Club building has been admirably furnished with mission furniture for the purposes of "The State Club," the ladies retaining for their own uses only the assembly room of the building. Dr. B. F. Dixon, who organized the club, is president and C. W. Gold secretary and treasurer. The membership is limited to fifty and has for an executive committee Judge H. G. Connor; Secretary of State Grimes; Superintendent of Public Instruction J. Y. Joyner; President D. H. Hill of the A. & M. College and Dr. Albert Anderson. The primary purpose of the club is to afford a meeting place in a social way for the State officers and their friends.

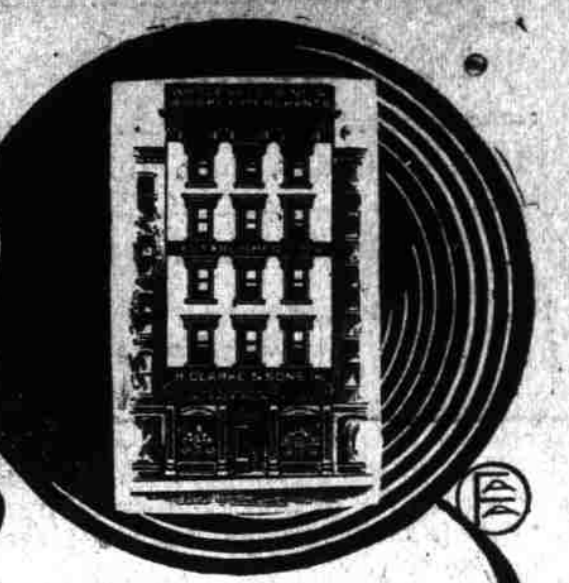
