TILLMAN GROWS WRATHY.

Inclined Not to Go to Columbia Dur

bia, S. C. Oct. 23.—Because he was asked to pay \$10 for a plate at the lunch which will be given to President Taft on the occasion of his visit to this city November 6th, Senator Tilman has declined to attend and states that he may not serve on the reception committee.

Senator Tillman says that while Columbia is to be the nominal host of Mr. Taft, the city expects the State at large to pay for the President's entertainment.

The letter in which Senator Tillman makes these statements is addressed to the Secretary of the Columbia Chamber of Commerce, who wrote, asking Mr. Tillman if he would attend the lunch. Senator Tillman says he received an invitation to the lunch and with it an invitation to send a check for \$10. "This may be a new way of conducting entertainments in South Carolina that will find favor in the future, but it is wholly contrary to all ideas of courtesy and hospitality that I ever heard of in this State, and I do not propose to lend any aid or countenance to it."


