## NEW ENGLAND FREE TRADE

Washington Post, Dem.

This suggestive utterance on the tariff question is credited to Senator Hoar, of Massachusetts:

"I should be perfectly willing to leave the whole subject of the tariff revision to a legislative tariff commission, composed entirely of free traders, I am so confident that in the end they would be forced to take a position entirely agreeable to the interests of New England manufacturers."

The plain meaning of this is that New England demands free raw material. The manufactures of that section have grown until they are quite able to take care of them. selves. The manufacturers find that protection, equitably distributed, or distributed with a view to equity as relates to all industries and all sections, works more injury than benefit to them. They find the new manu-factories of the South, favored by peculiar conditions as to transportation, are getting and holding the markets of the Northwest. The home demand is over-supplied, and their only chance for future success is to vary their products and open up foreign trade. To do this they must have cheap raw materials and cheap labor. The latter they can manage in their own way, for the labor market of the world is open to them, and they buy where labor can be had cheapest. Already the New England factories are filled with French-Canadians; and if this sort of labor is not cheap enough, England will send any number of mill hands at short notice. In fact our tariff, by preventing the working classes of Europe from exchanging their products for our food supplies, compels them to bring their labor inside the fence that we have erected, not against them, but against all the work they do at home. Our policy is to offer a high premium for immigration-that is the way we protect labor. We put up the cost of the products that the working people must buy, and we put down their wages by making them compete directly with all the labor in Europe. Therefore, the demand for cheap labor in New England is amply met and due provision is made for future contingencies. But the tariff, as it is, makes various raw materials cost so much that the most successful of New England manufacturers cannot compete with Europe in the markets of the world. Hence the glut of over-production is seriously felt, and hence Mr. Hear's significant intimation that he and the interests for which he speaks have been converted to the theory of Mr. Hewitt, to-wit-that we must have cheap raw materials if we are to grow in manufactures.



Our position, as clearly as we can state it, is this: We favor a tariff for revenue only, or only a sufficient revenue to meet the expenses of the go-vernment. ## THE FORESTS OF NORTH CAROLINA.

Washington C. Kerr, State Geologist, It will be seen from the United States census tables for 1870, that of its 50,000 square miles of territory, 40,000 are still covered with forests. The range and variety of prevalent and characteristic species of growth, being of course proportioned to those of the climate and soil, are very great.

There are in fact three well marked and broadly distinguished forest regions, corresponding to and de-pendent upon the three geographi-cal sub-divisions, Eastern, Middle and Western. And while the first section is characterized by a growth common in its prominent features to that in the Gulf States, as the long
