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A WEEK LATER FROM EUROPE.

The Cunard steamer Arabia arrived at New York yesterday in less than ten days from Liverpool. She brings London and Liverpool dates to the 13th instant.

It will be seen by the subjoined telegraphic summary of European news that she brings no reliable intelligence respecting the course of Russia in regard to the Turkish question. It seems, however, that a peaceful settlement of the difficulty continued to be expected, and the funds in both London and Paris were at higher quotations than at the date of our last previous advices.

Russia and Turkey.—Nothing definite had transpired in regard to the Turkish question, but it was the belief of almost every one that the matter would be amicably settled.

The London Post boldly asserts that the principalities will be evacuated by the Russians during the first week of September, and that the Allied fleets would soon after leave the Turkish waters.

Telegraphic despatches from St. Petersburg to August 5th state that the Czar had definitively accepted the proposals of the Four Powers.

A despatch from Trieste says the Porte accepts without modification the proposals drawn up at Vienna. An extraordinary ambassador was to leave Constantinople for St. Petersburg with the Sultan's decision as soon as the Russian troops were ordered to leave the principalities.

A later despatch, dated Constantinople, July 31st, says that intense excitement prevailed there in consequence of the refusal of the Hospodars of Moldavia and Wallachia to obey the summons of the Porte to repair to Constantinople.

A private despatch states that the insurgents had beaten back the imperial fleet from before Nankin, and had concluded not to attack Canton till September.
